

2017 Corvette Smartphone integration

Apple CarPlay and Android Auto



You will note the addition of a new icon on the home screen of the MyLink system. The “Projection” icon is the gateway to the new Apple CarPlay (iOS phones) and Android Auto (Android Phones). This was introduced in 2016 on select models and fully rolled out on 2017 models.

This system is a new link between your smartphone and the vehicle display which enables you to use select features and apps of from your phone as viewed on the vehicle touchscreen.

The functionality of both of these systems center around communication (phone and text), navigation (Apple Maps and Google Maps respectively) and Music (mp3 playback, Stitcher and Pandora for example).

This system will NOT enable video playback from your phone screen to the vehicle MyLink screen

To use this feature you need one of the following:

Apple CarPlay

iOS7.1 or greater and one of the following iPhone models (iPhone 5 or newer). No additional software is required. Apple CarPlay is integrated in to iOS.

A USB phone connection/charging⁺ cable. ⁺Please note that non all cables are created equal. To ensure proper CarPlay functionality a certified (MFi) Apple cable should be used.

CarPlay is compatible
with these iPhone models.



It is important to remember that Apple CarPlay is mutually exclusive from Bluetooth. Once activated, your Bluetooth connection to your phone will be disabled for the duration of the connection. All connection and communication activities will take place via your USB connection utilizing voice recognition and the music/media playback capabilities that are enabled via USB.

It is also important to remember that touch screen of your device can also be accessed during an Apple CarPlay connected session. It is recommended that your primary interaction come via the vehicle touch screen or via voice command such as Siri (Apple devices).

Android Auto

An Android phone running Android 5 (Lollipop) or higher and a compatible data plan.

A USB phone connection/charging cable

The Android Auto App (available on Google Play) – if the app is not installed when you plug in the phone for the first time you will be prompted to download it.

It is also important to remember that touch screen of your device will be **disabled** during an Android Auto connected session. All of your interaction will come via the vehicle touch screen or via voice command. Note also that Android Auto will still require Bluetooth for phone calls and if it isn't enabled when you plug in your device, it will be enabled when Android Auto is active.

Operation

Once you plug a compatible device in, you will see the Projection Icon change to either the Apple CarPlay logo or the Android Auto logo depending upon your device.

The rest of the functionality and available features for the MyLink system will remain consistent. Once you have left the Projection system, the icon will remain tied to your device until you unplug the compatible phone.

Example screens from Apple CarPlay

The home screen once CarPlay is enabled. You will notice immediately the similarity between your phone screen and the icons that appear on the CarPlay enabled MyLink system. Control of each of the functions on your phone are now accessible via their icon on the MyLink touchscreen.

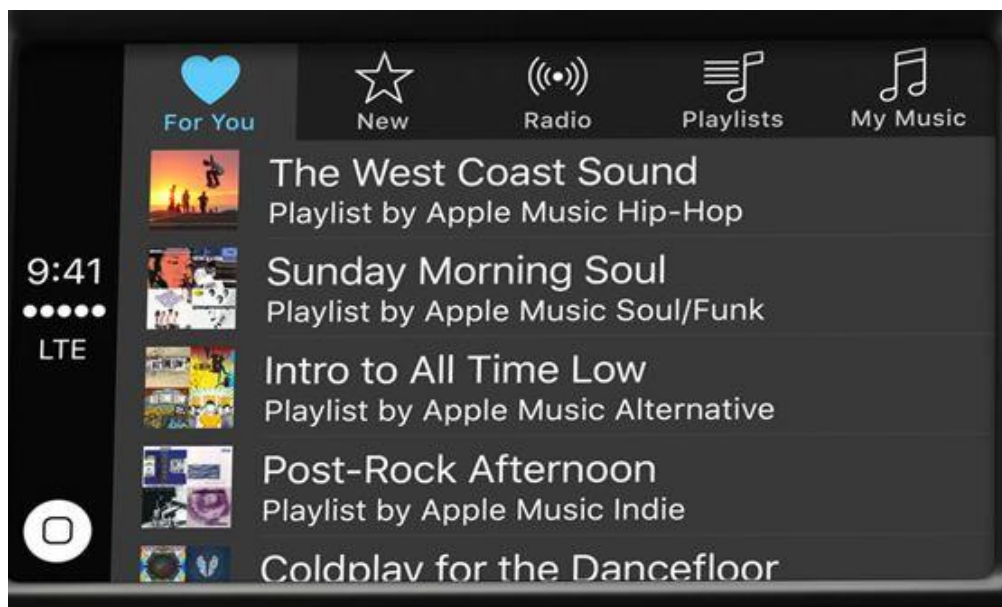
Tip – To exit Apple CarPlay and return to the main MyLink menu, press any hard key (Radio, Media, Home or Menu) or to exit any app and return to the CarPlay main menu, press the home button shown to the lower left of the touchscreen.

The Phone screen

The music screen. You will notice that you have access to your playlists, your music library and iTunes radio recommended content and subscriptions.

An example of a text message alert. You can use Siri to listen to and reply to incoming text messages.



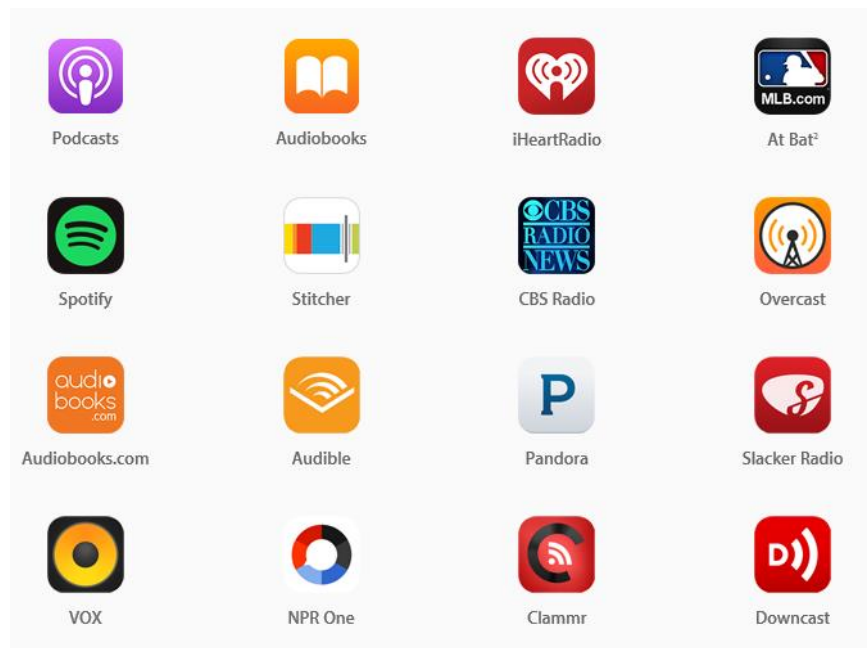

The navigation screen – the CarPlay navigation takes advantage of the integrated Apple Maps system and full integration with your contact list. Again, very familiar to those who use the Map features of your compatible cell phone.

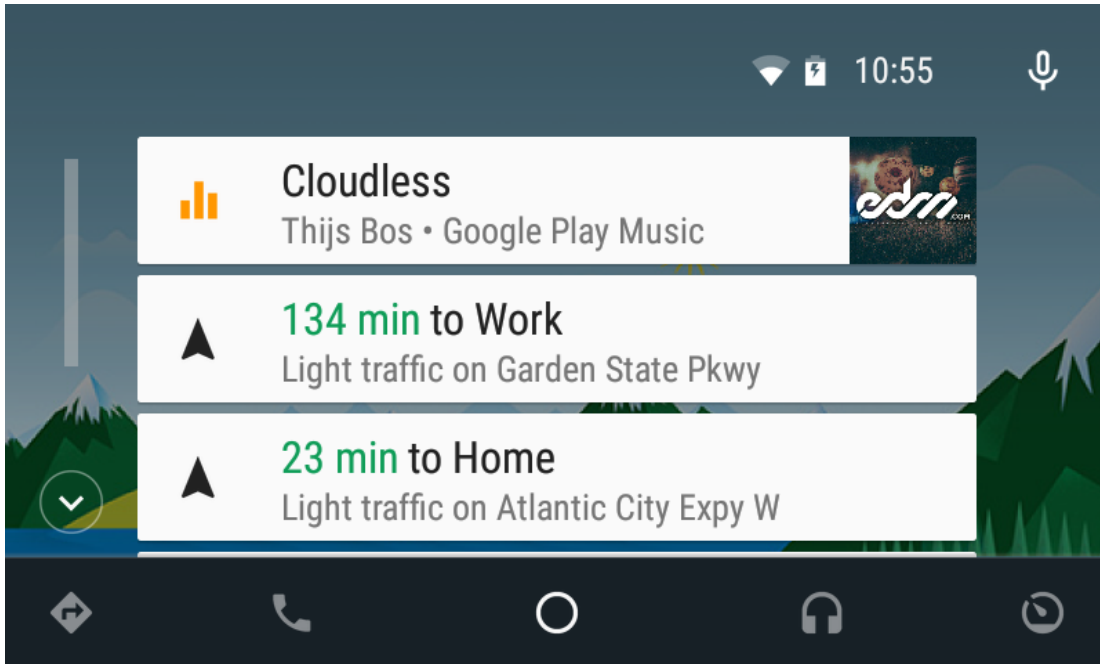

Tip - To exit any application and return to the main Apple CarPlay screen, press the Home button on the lower left of the screen.

Android Auto example screens (please note that due to the differences in Android compatible hardware, your screen may differ from the content displayed).

The home screen – The Android Auto takes a different approach than Apple CarPlay. It uses a “home screen” feature to put the most current information at your fingertips all in one place. To change system features, press the icons along the bottom tray. In order from left to right navigation (via Google Maps), Phone, Home button, Music, vehicle/system information.

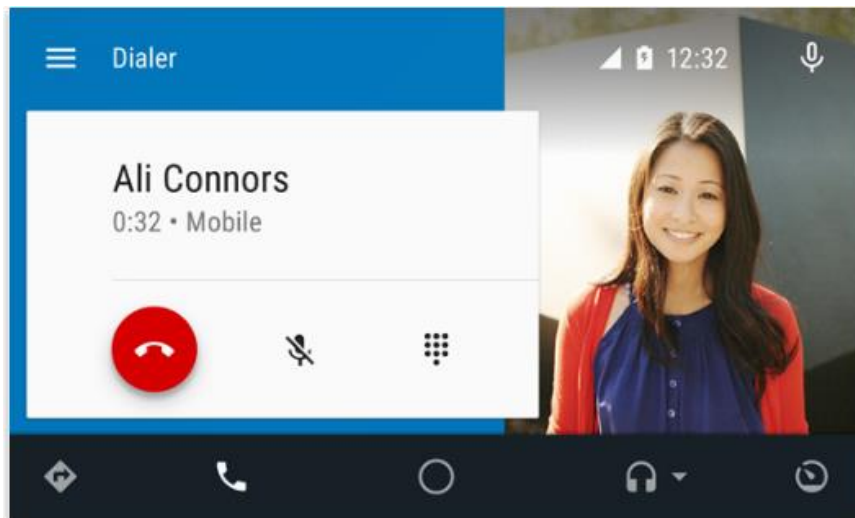
Tip – To exit Android Auto and return to the main MyLink menu, press any hard key (Radio, Media, Home or Menu) or press the home button shown at the bottom of the touchscreen from the home page. Pressing the home button inside of any app will return to the home page.

The navigation interface



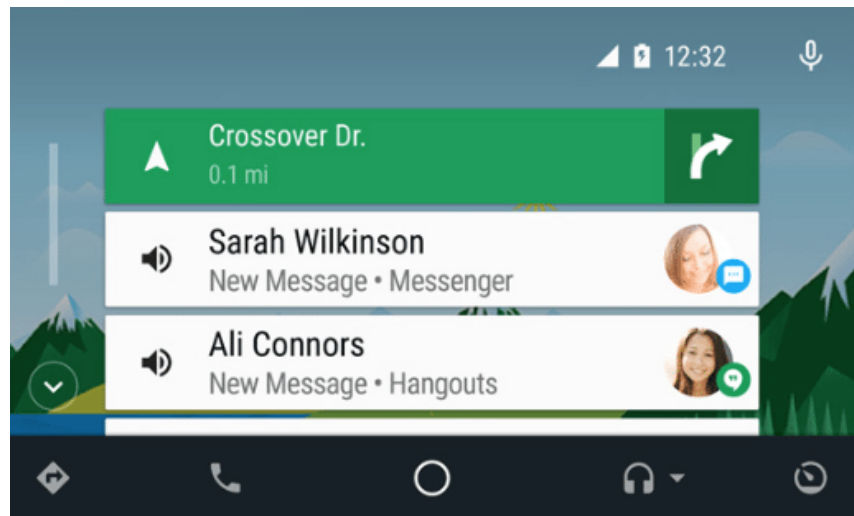
